



Secure Flight Implementations

During June 2011, Sabre Travel network continues its release of new tools and procedures to help Sabre Connected travel agents comply with the U.S. Department of Transportation's Secure Flight requirements.

The features being released 01 June include:

- **PNR Optional Edit** capabilities that include NEW "hard edits that require SFPD in order to end the PNR and improved "soft" edits that simply provide a warning message and/or places the PNR on queue for further action. Optional edits warning messages are available that identify not only which segment in the PNR is missing SFPD; but when there are multiple passengers, which passenger needs SFPD added
- **Masking of personal identification information** entered in the PNR, to reduce the agency's risk of being held accountable for potential identify theft by ensuring passenger data is secured in accordance with data privacy laws. The DOB and gender in the SSR DOCS field and the redress number in the SSR DOCO field will be masked from any display.

On 12 June we'll be retiring the temporary service we installed in October 2010 that automatically queue places PNRs with missing SFPD on either QUEUE 42 (ticketed PNRs) or 44 (un-ticketed PNRs).

Note: Agencies wanting to continue to have PNRs missing SFPD placed on queue will need to activate **the NEW Secure Flight Optional Queue Place edit available on 01 June 2011.**

Activation: Input W/KSECFLTQ±ON

Other new features coming later will be announced at Agency eServices and include:

- Secure Flight PNR Search for, List or Print PNRs missing SFPD
- Secure Flight PNR Search for and Queue PNRs missing SFPD
- Direct traveler entry of SFPD via Sabre Virtually There
