



Secure Flight SSR ADPI

In conjunction with the U.S. Secure Flight initiative, Sabre will implement the new IATA approved SSR ADPI (Advise passenger information), which enables airlines to advise travel agents if required Secure Flight Passenger Data (SFPD) , is missing from a PNR. The travel agent will then be expected to provide the passenger(s) SFPD using the IATA SSR DOCS.

Airline personnel and teletype reject agents will have the ability to enter the SSR ADPI in the General Facts and Host Facts Field requesting Secure Flight documentation. The SSR ADPI will be transmitted to Sabre PNRs with the mandated KK action/advice code. The PNR will be placed on system Queue 42 with a PIC code of 165 "PASSENGER SECURITY DATA REQUIRED"

Once the agency updates the PNR with the appropriate SSR DOCS, they can remove the SSR ADPI using the 31st or 41st entry. Upon End transaction, the SSR DOCS, containing the secure flight information, will be retransmitted back to the airline.

This implementation has been scheduled for September 30, 2010.
